- Advocates change minds
- Local governments change zoning
- Local governments (and state & feds) build sewer and water
- Local, state, and federal government subsidies, incentives, and zoning lower the cost of land
- Developers, businesses, and housing organizations find investors
- Businesses and schools develop a workforce
- Nonprofits screen buyers/renters
- Nonprofits/housing organizations enforce long-term affordability guarantees
