
Corridor 4 - West US-31, Beitner, Keystone

The West US-31, Beitner, Keystone corridor is located in Grand Traverse County in the townships of Green Lake, Blair, and Garfield. The corridor is approximately 13.8 miles long, and it begins at the Benzie County line and continues to South Airport Road. It has two lanes with posted speeds of 45 miles per hour to 55 miles per hour. Major intersections include South Long Lake Road, West Silver Lake Road, Beitner Road, Cass Road and Birmley Road. The roadway surface is asphalt and it has three existing functional classes. From the Benzie County line to M-37, the functional class is Principal Arterial. Between M-37 and Birmley Road it is considered Minor Arterial. From Birmley Road to South Airport Road it is classified as a Major Collector. It has an average daily traffic (ADT) count of 21,737 cars per day, though this count varies along the length of the corridor. The total land area within the buffer is approximately 674 acres.


Corridor 5 - Garfield Road

The Garfield Road corridor is located in Grand Traverse County in the townships of Paradise, East Bay, Blair, and Garfield. The roadway is considered a major connector between Traverse City, the City of Cadillac, and other surrounding towns and villages. The corridor is approximately 14.3 miles long; it begins at M-113 in Kingsley and continues north to US-31. From M-113 to Birmley Road, Garfield Road has two lanes with posted speeds of 55 miles per hour and has a functional classification of Major Collector. From Birmley Road to US-31, it has five lanes with posted speeds of 35 miles per hour to 45 miles per hour. It is made of asphalt and major intersections include M-113, Birmley Road, Hammond Road, South Airport Road, 8th Street, and US-31/M-72/Front Street. It has an average daily traffic (ADT) count of 21,283 cars per day, though this count varies along the length of the corridor. The total land area within the buffer is approximately 706 acres.


Corridor 6 – Hammond Road

The Hammond Road corridor is located in Grand Traverse County, in both Garfield and East Bay Townships. The corridor is approximately 5.1 miles long and begins at Keystone Road on the west and ends at 5 Mile Road on the east. It ranges from two to five lanes with a posted speed of 55 miles per hour. Major intersections include 3 Mile Road, 4 Mile Road, Garfield Avenue, and La Franier Road. The roadway surface is asphalt and the existing functional class is Minor Arterial. It has an average daily traffic (ADT) count of 11,805 cars per day, though this count varies along the length of the corridor. Total land area within the buffer is 287 acres.

Corridor 7 – 3 Mile Road

The 3 Mile Road corridor is located in Grand Traverse County in the township of East Bay. The corridor is approximately 5.7 miles long and begins at US-31 on the north and terminates at Garfield Road on the south. From US-31 to Hammond Road, 3 Mile Road has two lanes with posted speeds of 55 miles per hour and a functional classification of Minor Arterial. From Hammond Road to Garfield Road, it has two lanes with posted speeds of 55 miles per hour and a functional classification of S5 miles per hour and a functional classification of Major Collector. The 3 Mile Road corridor is made of asphalt, and major intersections include South Airport Road, US-31, and Hammond Road. It has an average daily traffic (ADT) count of 18,910 cars per day, though this count varies along the length of the corridor. Total land area within the buffer is approximately 278 acres.
