NORTHWEST LOWER, MI— Students and job seekers can learn about a wide variety of careers by watching a new set of videos on the Northwest Michigan Works! website. The videos were recorded during the 2021 Virtual MiCareerQuest Northwest which was held online May 12. 45 schools from across Northwest Lower Michigan registered for the event which included nearly 50 employers.
