

Art and cultural organizations along Alcona County's US-23 Heritage Route are ready for Michigan's first Lake Huron Discovery Tour free, but entry into the park planned for October 9 through October 12.

The inaugural tour promises many unique and interesting art exhibitions, activities, outdoor adventures and more from Standish to Mackinaw City with many free or low cost family events.

Alcona County's activities for the weekend stand out as one of the most diverse as far as events and activities go including a dark sky observation through telescopes at Negwegon State Park, handson events and demonstrations with artists, a lighthouse festival, author event, historic unveiling, a film screening and a haunted trail

. The weekend begins Friday, Oct. 9 with a Dark Sky event in Black River at the Mountain Inn Bar and Grill, 5495 US-23, Black River at 7 p.m. with special guest speaker, Mary Stewart Adams. She is the dark sky program director of the Headlands International Dark Sky Park in Emmet County, Mich.



PROCLAMATION

DESIGNATION OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY

WHEREAS, the City of Alpena and the Saginaw Chippewa Tribe are primary sponsors of the Lake Huron Discovery Tour that has fostered regional collaborative partnerships for cross-promotion of the arts, culture, history and humanities of our region; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alpena wishes to extend its appreciation to the Saginaw Chippewa Tribe for its contributions and involvement in the Lake Huron Discovery Tour and other events and activities along the Lake Huron shoreline; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alpena wishes to recognize and honor the long standing history and contributions of the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe and other Indigenous peoples of Michigan to the region of Northeast Michigan and beyond; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alpena appreciates and embraces the value of multi-cultural awareness and preservation of Indigenous culture in our region and throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alpena desires to develop a strong and productive relationship with all Indigenous peoples, including the Saginaw Chippewa Tribe, based on mutual respect and trust; and

WHEREAS, the idea of Indigenous Peoples Day was first proposed in 1977 by a delegation of native nations to the United Nations; and

WHEREAS, Indigenous Peoples Day is an opportunity to educate the public about pre-existing Indian cultures that continue to exist and thrive in present day America.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Matthew J. Waligora, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Alpena, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM October 12, 2015 in Alpena as:

INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY



Geocaching on the Sunrise Coast

A 200-mile long geocaching adventure! Begins Friday, October 9!

Beginning the weekend of October 9, 2015, the US 23 Discovery Geocaching Trail will guide participants on a high tech scavenger hunt seeking places of importance from Standish to Mackinaw City. Near each interesting location in the counties along US 23, a geocache (container) will be hidden. Beginning October 9, 2015, a newly designed US 23 themed souvenir path tag will be awarded to the first 150 geocachers locating 25 of the 30 + newly placed geocaches. To be eligible for the path tag, geocachers must travel from cache to cache, discovering the US 23 sites and answering specific questions on the passport form. When the geocaches are activated on October 9^{th} , the passport can be downloaded here.






