I. Call to Order and Introductions

The meeting was called to order at 9:34 by temporary Chair Naomi Singer. Attendance was recorded for those present and of online participants.

II. Additions to Agenda

Cassidy requested that the Performance Evaluation be added to New Business. It was decided that the topic would be covered during Partner Updates.

III. Approval of Previous Minutes from August 12, 2025

Motion by Carolyn to adopt the meeting minutes from August 12, 2025 as distributed, supported by Garon. All in favor, none opposed.

VIII. Partner Updates

a. Networks Northwest

Cassidy reported that the work to rebuild the website is now underway and that a draft should be ready for review early next week. There will be about a week for feedback and revisions before moving on to the process of moving the domain and hosting. If all goes according to plan the site should be live by the end of September.

Cassidy reminded the committee that they are aiming to have Performance Evaluation completed by the October meeting. The committee reviewed the draft Performance Evaluation and provided feedback. Sheridan Jones offered to complete the testimonial needed for the evaluation. Cassidy will edit the draft as suggested by the committee and share for further review once completed.

b. MDOT

o North Region

Ben discussed the challenges of enforcing no parking along the corridor without a traffic control order, however temporary private property signs are allowed to be used. Ben also informed the committee that the tree maintenance staff person is retiring and a new staff member will be starting soon. He will coordinate with the new staff and the maintenance crew to address tree maintenance needs along the corridor.

o Pure Michigan Byways

Clayton provided an overview of corridor management planning for byways. He discussed the process of setting goals, objectives, and strategies to preserve, promote, and protect the corridor. He discussed the need for clear vision and mission statements in the future corridor management plan.

Clayton also reminded everyone about the upcoming Pure Michigan Byway Workshop on November 3 in Gaylord, MI.

IX. County Representatives

a. Emmet County Planning and Zoning

Laura provided an update on the Emmet County Master Plan, including ongoing efforts to gather community input. She shared information on the community survey and announced three upcoming open house events. The open houses will take place on October 8th at McKinley Township Hall from 5 to 7pm, October 9th at Readmond Township Hall from 5 to 7pm, and October 11th at North Central Michigan College Library Conference Rm from 10am to 12pm. Laura

also shared the formation of the Engagement Committee and requested volunteers, especially from underrepresented areas of the county.

X. Municipal Representatives

d. West Traverse Township

Garon shared concern that the future of the W. Traverse Township Hall is now being discussed. That potential future, unless there is an outpouring of public opposition for township officials to stay in the current building, could result in 1) A new hall being constructed 2) The old hall being sold 3) The old hall being rented out for use by a non-profit or private concern 4) Potential (though hopefully not likely) demolition of the old hall, or 5) A combination of some of the above. There seems to be little appetite, by some township officials, to spend the resources needed to stay in the current building

XI. Organization Representatives

a. Little Traverse Conservancy

Caitlin reported that there is ongoing work on the new trail at Woody's Woods Preserve with parking on Church Road, between the Albert Johnson and Woody Woods properties. Parking along the corridor is also being monitored and if it becomes problematic expansion of offsite parking may be considered.

b. Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians - None.

XII. Public Comment

Sheridan expressed appreciation for Clayton's presentation and for Little Traverse Conservancy's efforts to help alleviate congestion on M-119.

XIII. Old Business

a. Ice Storm Public Info Session Update

Cassidy shared information provided by Dale informing the committee that he had arranged for Ben Vehling to work with them at Pond Hill on October 8th at 2:30 PM and was seeking approval to move this item along. She also noted that there had been some discussion to pay Ben \$200 for the Info Session. Dave informed Cassidy through the online meeting chat that he had received packets from Christian Anderson, who he believed would be speaking at the Info Session, that had been shared with Dale. Naomi stated that she would contact Dale following the meeting's conclusion to clarify details of the Info Session.

A motion was made by Naomi to approve Ben Vehling to present on tree sustainability as a result of the recent ice storm on October 8, 2025 at Pond Hill Farm at 2:30PM, with cost not exceeding

\$200. Supported by Joey. Verbal vote was taken, 6 in favor, 1 opposed.

b. FY2026 Work Plan - None.

c. Tree Cutting Ordinance - Proposed Memo

A motion was made by Joey to accept the wording of the proposed memo to send to Emmet County Planning and Zoning regarding the Master Plan update, supported by Franz. All in favor, none opposed.

d. Dark Sky Initiative - Tabled for October meeting.

e. Readmond Township Restroom Proposal Update

The committee discussed Redmond Township's proposal to add restrooms to their parks plan. Concerns were raised that permanent restrooms along M-119 would worsen traffic and harm the scenic view. The committee strongly opposed permanent structures, saying they would cause more issues than they solve. Alternatives like placing porta-potties at off-road locations were discussed. It was noted that the conservancy likely wouldn't support permanent facilities, and local townships lack the resources to maintain them long-term.

f. Law Enforcement and Signage Update

This item was discussed during Ben's updates from MDOT, no additional discussion.
