## Opportunity for Entrepreneurs to Set the Foundation For a Successful Launch

NORTHWEST LOWER, MI–Entrepreneurs will learn about the steps needed to successfully launch a new business in a series of classes in Traverse City. The Set the Foundation classes will meet for six consecutive Wednesdays beginning February 13 and ending March 20. The classes will run from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm at the Conference Center in the Northwest Michigan Works! Building, 1209 South Garfield. Set the Foundation is being provided by the Northwest Michigan Small Business Development Center (SBDC) and is co-sponsored by Crosshatch Center for Art & Ecology and the USDA.

Set the Foundation is intended for the first time business owner or the owner of an early-stage existing business looking to improve operations, target markets, and address essential aspects of growing the business. The class uses Rhonda Abrams' 6-Week Startup, which is a step-by-step guide that every entrepreneur needs for successfully launching their new venture, making money, and being successful for years to come. The class will follow a comprehensive program that breaks down the many tasks of launching a business into six, manageable weeks featuring in-session work groups, class instruction, and guest speakers.

Amanda Kik, Co-founder/director of Crosshatch Center for Art & Ecology, participated in a very similar intensive training. "This is the kind of in-depth planning that can make for a successful business," said Kik. "Taught by folks who know what they're talking about, you will leave this course more confident and ready to tackle your dream."

The classes will be facilitated by Northwest SBDC Regional Director, Annie Olds, and SBDC Business Consultant, Joni Krolczyk. The topics to be discussed include:

- Efficiently and properly laying the foundation in preparation to launch
- Getting the information needed to make big decisions
- Connecting to a network of resource professionals
- Developing an operational strategy
- Determining what it means to finance a new venture

This \$450 class is underwritten by Crosshatch Center for Art & Ecology and is available to individuals at a significantly reduced rate of \$100 per person.
