## Grants Awarded to Support Census Outreach in Northwest Michigan

TRAVERSE CITY, MI – \$110,000 in grants will support 10 northwest Michigan agencies and collaboratives in their U.S. Census outreach activities in historically undercounted communities. The grants, awarded by Networks Northwest in partnership with the Michigan Nonprofit Association, range from \$5,000 to \$15,000. Grant recipients were selected by a committee of community members who offered a diverse representation of the region and who work with historically undercounted communities in northwest Michigan.
